Brief Overview

The eSafety Commissioner has the power to direct a social media organisation to take down offensive material. Using the reporting form students and parents can link evidence with the outcome of most cyberbullying incidents being taken down within 48 hours.

This resource is specifically created for Indigenous families. Be Deadly Online is a community program about the big issues online, like bullying, reputation and respect for others. Key issues addressed:

- Sexting and respect
- Reputation
- Responsible online and mobile use.

Family Zone is a paid webfiltering program. Currently downloaded by 350, 000 families Australia wide, the program manages screen time, removes adult content, restricts social media and gives overall cyber support.
