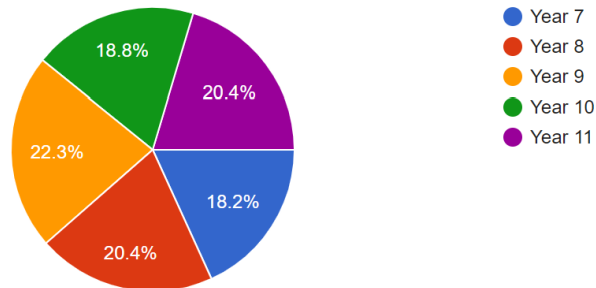


Student survey results – August 2021

I am in:

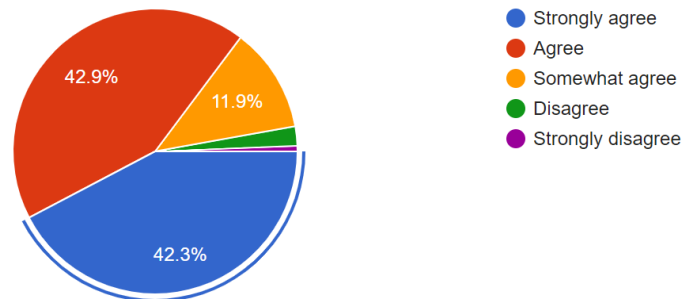
319 responses

I have good technology and internet access that enable me to successfully learn online at home.

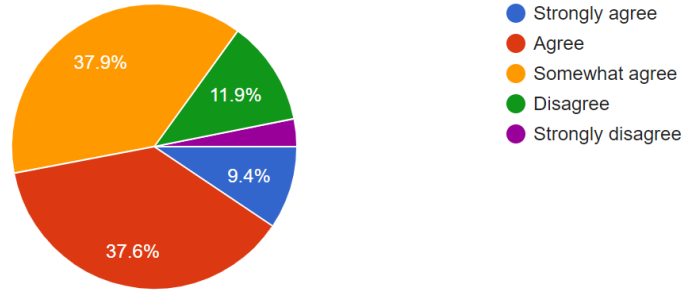

My teachers plan interesting class activities and give thorough explanations of what is required.

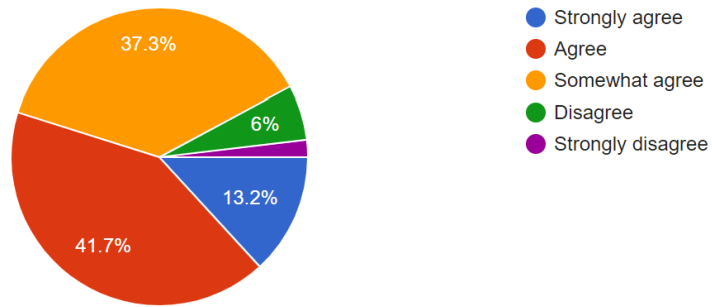

My teachers provide work that is challenging but achievable.

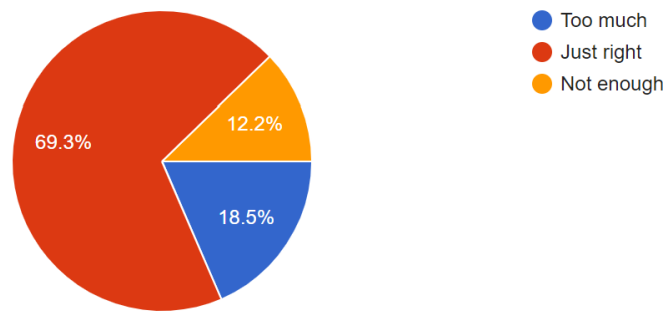

The amount of face-to-face Zoom lessons provided by my teachers is;

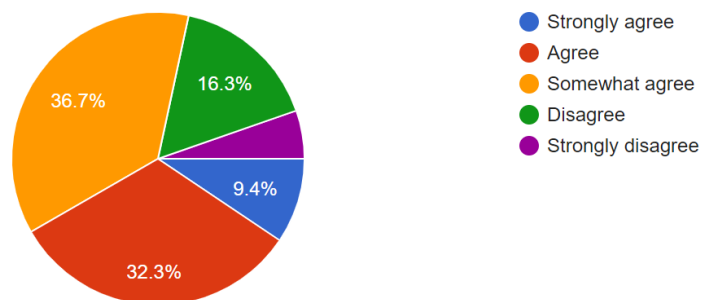

The online learning experiences provided by my teachers challenge and extend my thinking and creativity.

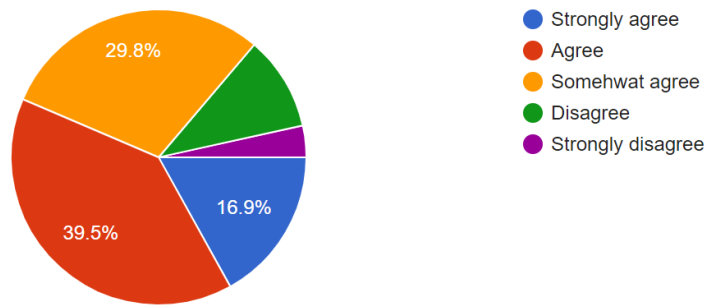

This will also be a good point of reflection for the teaching staff.

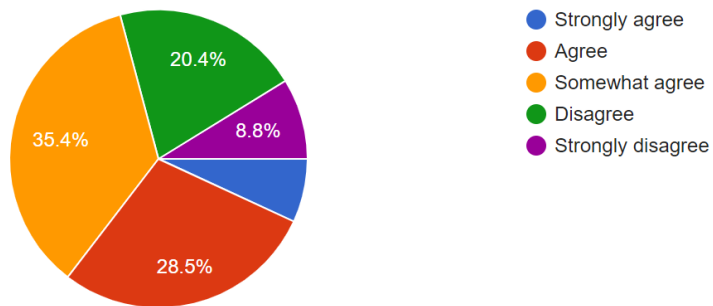
I feel comfortable asking my teachers for help when I need it.

The amount of work my teachers expect me to complete is just right.

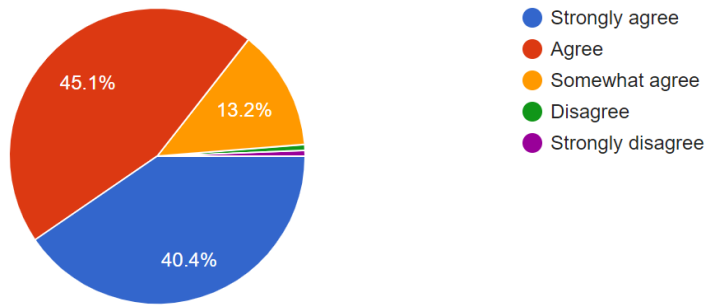

My teachers expect me to always do my best.

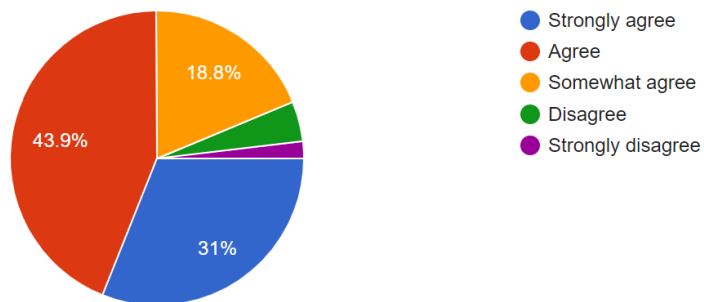

I always try my best in remote learning.

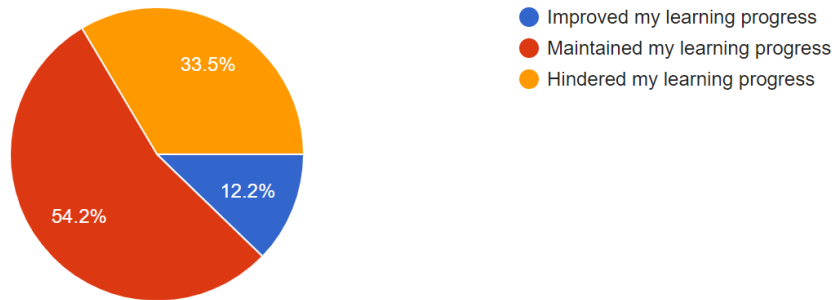

Online learning has:

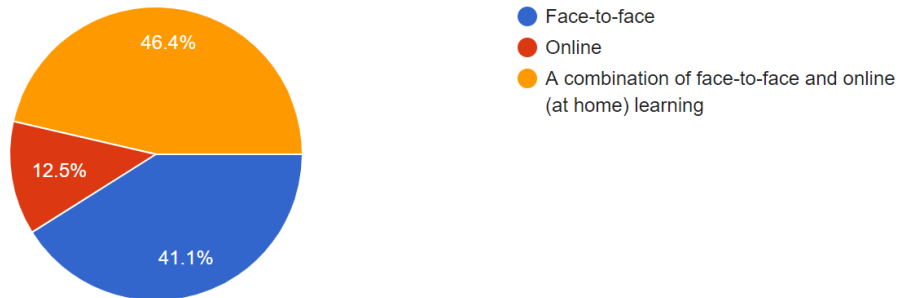
